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# EU COMMON SECURITY AND DEFENCE POLICY

## CSDP LAUNCH IN 2000

with focus on  
**Crisis Management Operations,**  
building on military and civilian  
capabilities

- ▶ Some **30 operations/missions** launched since 2003
- ▶ Need for **collaborative capability development** has been the key driver since the creation of the Agency
- ▶ **EU Global Strategy for Foreign and Security Policy** of June 2016 further strengthens CSDP and EDA

2007 LISBON TREATY:

### **Comprehensive approach**

Provisions on the Common Security and Defence Policy (Article 42 TEU):

- ▶ Member States shall make civilian and military capabilities available to the Union for the implementation of the **common security and defence policy**
- ▶ Member States shall undertake to progressively improve their **military capabilities**

followed by Implementation Plan in November 2016

Deepening defence cooperation:

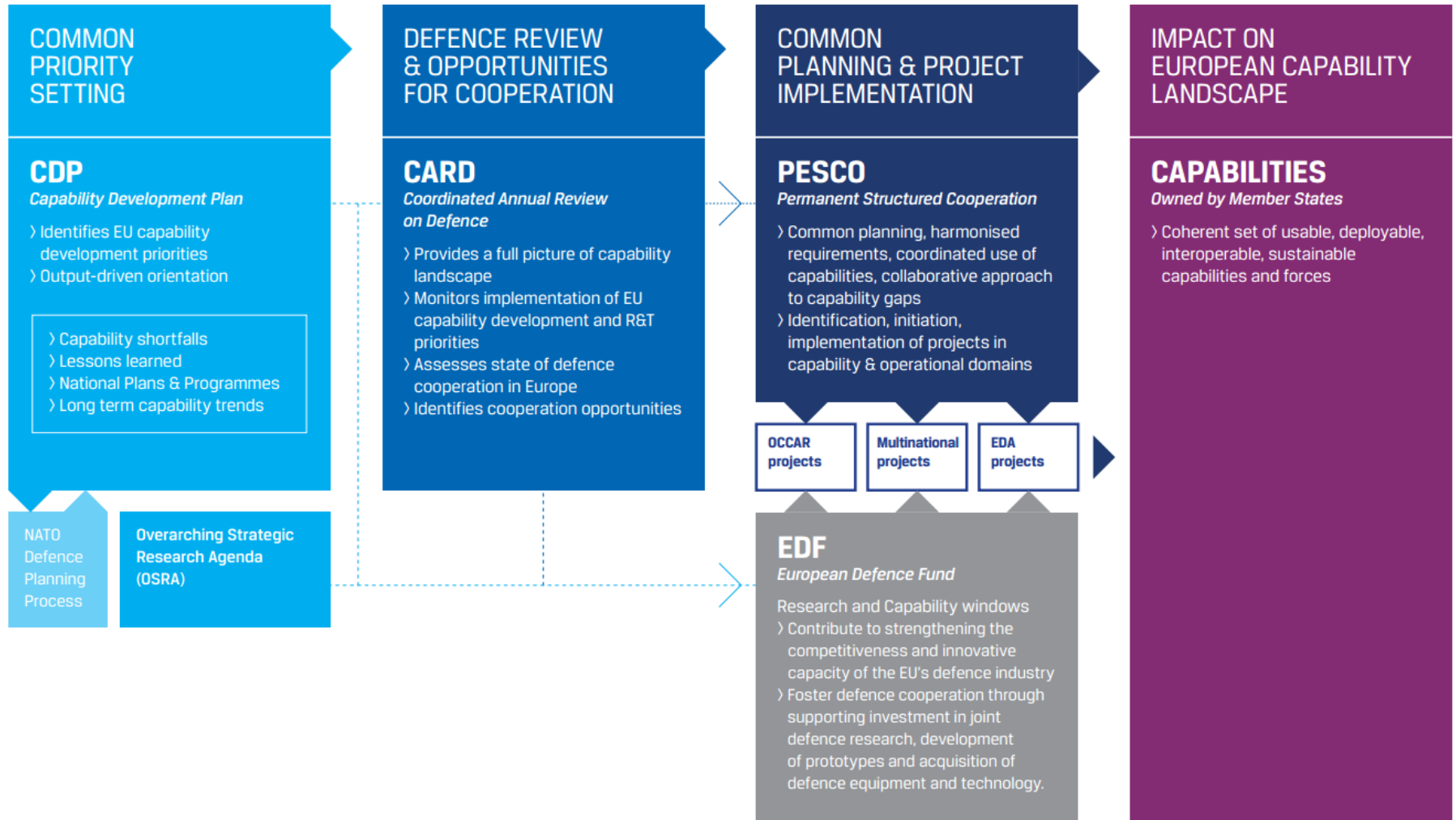
- ▶ EDA key cooperation tool and Member States to make « full use » of EDA's potential

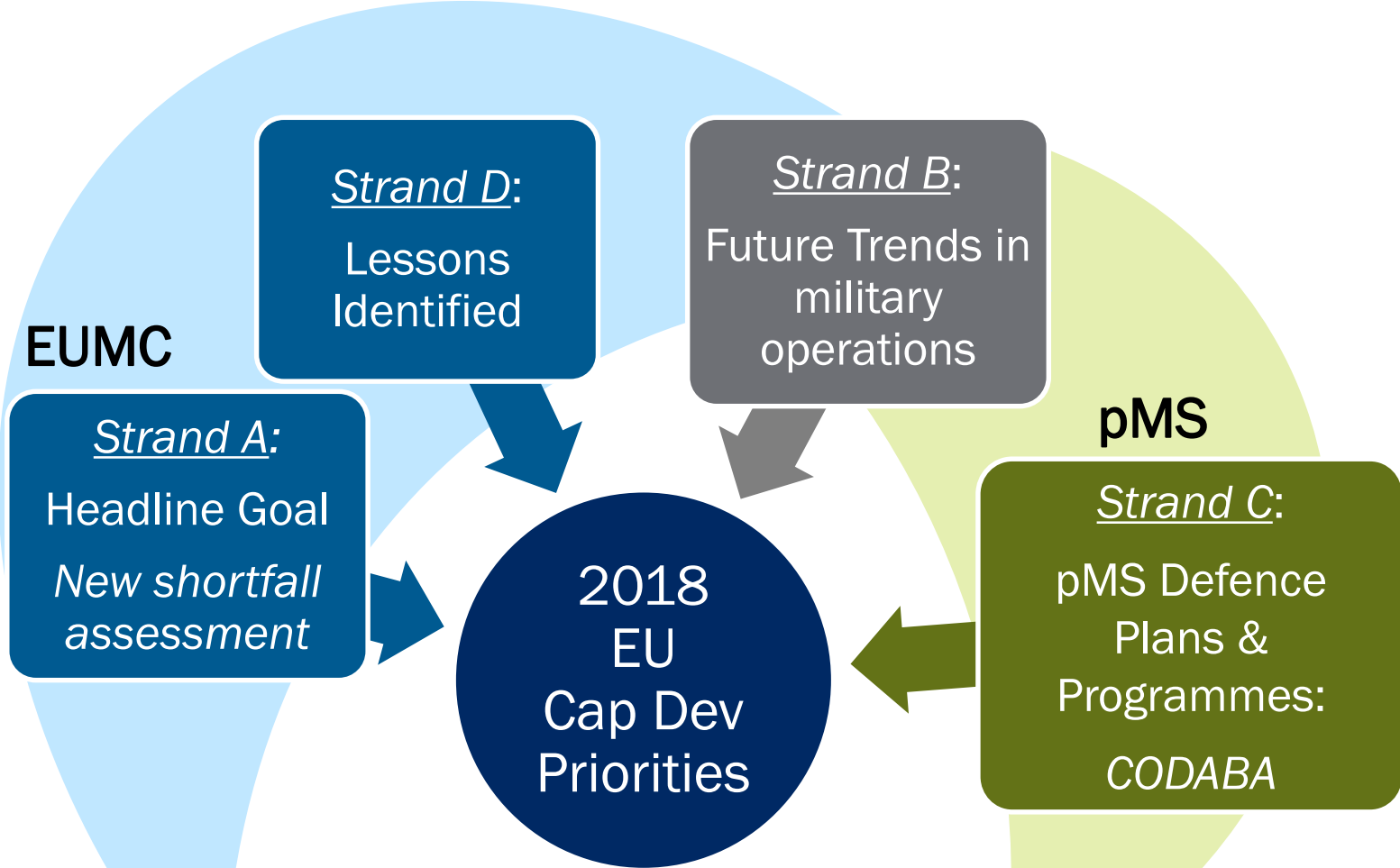
